#### Chairman's Message

What a busy and exciting year 2019 has been at YMCA Humber. With our new CEO, Debbie Cook at the helm we've set out our ambitious 3-year strategic intent.

In addition to developing our £8 million Freeman Street scheme we've purchased two new 'move-on' houses, hosted a national history exhibition, delivered safe, supported accommodation to 394 people and 271 hours of mental health counselling. Over 4000 attendances were recorded at our youth projects.

With the delivery of our new people strategy we've become a better employer, resulting in a wonderful team in place to deliver continuous improvement across all our services.

With a new income generation strategy in place the charity has plans to grow and develop; challenging but very exciting times ahead.

It's a pleasure to reflect on all that the Team at YMCA Humber has achieved in 2019. My first year in this new role has been incredibly busy but at the same time most rewarding and thoroughly enjoyable.

I am blessed to be able to go home every day with the knowledge that everything we do at our wonderful organisation is making a positive difference. I see this reflected with our residents in particular who, with our support, make the steps towards independent living in the knowledge that we will always be there for them.

In 2019, YMCA Humber offered 246 engagement events to residents in our supported accommodation alone. This is in addition to the people we've supported through our mental health project, and at our youth clubs.

Much of 2019 has been spent progressing our new scheme for aspirational facilities at Freeman Street, Grimsby with a view to being on site in March 2020.

In addition we've purchased two new properties to ensure we have quality 'move-on' accommodation for our residents.

With our ambitious strategic plans to develop our services across the whole of the Humber these are exciting times. A huge 'thank you' to everyone who has supported the charity to date.

Deliver a new 'People Strategy', to demonstrate how we will support, train and develop our staff to deliver excellent services.




YMCA Humber provides holistic support to young people accessing our services. We believe in giving young people the right skills for life. By helping them to manage their mental and physical health we aim to reduce their chances of becoming homeless in the future. We work to ensure young people can belong, contribute and thrive.

# Our teams work in a person-centred way and we are working towards becoming a trauma-informed organisation.

In 2019 we offered 246 engagement events for our residents. As well as general support, mental health support and training we also offer specific 'money matters' advice to help our residents manage their finances.

#### **AT ONE Mental Health Project**

At YMCA Humber we are passionate about ending homelessness, but we understand that ending homelessness is not just providing a bed and safe place to stay; which is where our AT ONE project comes in. AT ONE provides interventions to improve the mental health and well-being of young people between the ages of 16 and 35 living in North East Lincolnshire.

AT ONE provides a suite of opportunities tailored to the needs of the individual as it adopts a flexible approach, where resources allow.

- Open to members of the public on a referral-by or self-referral basis
- Open to all our residents
- Providing the opportunity to participate in activities intended to reduce anxiety in a social setting, challenge negative thinking, promote positivity and learning around issues that can impact positively on their mental and emotional well-being

## Celebrating our History

#### 175 Anniversary Roadshow

During 2019 YMCA Humber made positive Grimsby headlines, due to the announcement of a fantastic new development in the Freeman Street area. Grimsby was also chosen as the flagship town, for the inaugural launch and one of only ten UK YMCAs to be given the honour of hosting the '175th Anniversary Roadshow'.

The roadshow, hosted at Grimsby Central Hall was attended by over 400 local people, many of them schoolchildren, learning all about 175 years of YMCA history.

The first ever branch of the YMCA in Grimsby was formed in 1882 by local grocer James Kirkby Riggall. Then the first official Grimsby YMCA was established in 1906 by Fred Bacon, who was instrumental in the first local base, in Heneage Road, in 1908. The current Peaks Lane site was built in 1972.

Our four Development Associates attended the worldwide 175th Anniversary celebrations in London, to continue with their personal development with YMCA.

A time capsule has been created by one of the school children who attended the roadshow, ready to bury at the ground-breaking ceremony for the new Freeman Street site.

#### Fundraising & Thanks

Because of you, 394 residents moved in and received support from a key worker, essential home items and a dedicated plan to help them thrive throughout 2019. You also provided the stepping stone towards independence to 153 residents by donating to YMCA Humber
